Pamlico County Sheriff's Office Investigates Drug-Related Overdose Death, One Arrested on Charges of Death by Distribution



Stephanie Nelson, 24, from Craven County, was charged with one count of Death by Distribution of Controlled Substances. Nelson is being held on a secured bond of \$500,000.00 secured bond.

The Pamlico County Sheriff's Office has made an arrest in connection with a drug-related overdose death that occurred in early 2024.

On February 10, 2024, deputies responded to a residence at 394 Old Bay River Road in Grantsboro, NC, for a death investigation. Upon further investigation, it was determined that the cause of death was a fentanyl-related overdose.

Through an extensive investigation, Pamlico County Sheriff's Office investigators identified Stephanie Nelson as the individual who supplied the drugs that led to the fatal overdose. On May 19, 2025, Nelson was arrested by the Pamlico County Sheriff's Office and charged with **Death by Distribution**. She was issued a **\$500,000 secured bond**.

"Our hearts go out to the victim's family and loved ones," said Sheriff Chris Davis. "This arrest is a reflection of our commitment to holding drug dealers accountable and fighting the opioid crisis that continues to take lives in our community. We will continue to work tirelessly to protect the citizens of Pamlico County from the devastating effects of illegal narcotics."

The Sheriff's Office remains committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of all residents through proactive law enforcement and strong community partnerships.

Since the award was first bestowed back in 1984, the Hubert L. Monk Leadership Award has been given to two deserving PCHS athletes who embodied the ideals Coach Monk valued in his players. Coach Monk was a Pamlico County institution both as a coach and a teacher until his death. He believed in the team, knowing that it was the team concept that brought his players together. BOC Presented With 2025-26 Budget

The Pamlico County Board of Commissioners were presented with the County's fiscal year 2025-26 budget recommendation at their regular meeting on Monday evening. County Manager Mark Brewington went over all the numbers of the \$26,976,604 budget with the Board in a power point presentation. Funding for the expenditures will come from \$24,845,407 in projected revenue and \$2,131,197 from the County's fund balance. The budget does not increase the current property tax rate which remains at \$0.645 per \$100 of value. Compared to the previous fiscal year, most departments saw their budgets reduced with elimination of the majority of capital requests. County employees will receive a 2.5% cost of living increase in their pay. As far as outside agency funding goes, there were small increases across the board from the previous year but no agency received quite what they requested from the County. The only agency that saw their

funding reduced was the Pamlico County Rescue Squad, which saw a reduction of \$97,250. Brewington also presented data to the Board showing where the County's projected funds are coming from and where they are going. Ad Valorem taxes make up about 50% of the County's revenue. As far as expenditures go, Public Safety accounts for about 32% of the budget followed by Education at 23% and General Government at 18%. The water department budget

was also reviewed and while there is no proposed increase in water fees, there are proposed increases in water tap and meter fees in order to keep up with inflationary costs. There will also be no increase in the fire tax rate for any of the County's 9 departments. So, what is next for the budget? The Commissioners scheduled a public hearing on the budget for their next meeting on June 16. They then have until a June 30 deadline to approve this budget or some variation of it.

Local Principal Completes Leadership Program



Rebecca Lansche, principal of Pamlico County High School, recently completed the Distinguished Leadership in Practice Program (DLP), a year-long leadership development program for practicing school principals from all regions of the state. The program is designed and provided by the North Carolina Principals and Assistant Principals' Association (NCPAPA) and sponsored by the North Carolina Alliance for School Leadership Development (NCASLD).

Principals engage in a series of authentic activities throughout the year- long experience that are designed to build the capacity of their schools and their own capacity as "Distinguished" school leaders.

"The leadership of the school principal is by far one of the most important factors in school quality. By completing this very rigorous program, our DLP graduates have demonstrated their commitment to continuous improvement by working to improve their leadership skills as they simultaneously improve their schools. We are proud to include them in the ranks of successful DLP completers," said Dr. Shirley Prince, NCPAPA Executive Director.

On Thursday, May 29, 2025, at approximately 8:00 p.m. Pamlico County deputies received a report that an individual had been shot and possibly killed at a residence in the Vandemere community of Pamlico County. Deputies responded to the location where they discovered the body of Debra Balance Jones, 62 of Vandemere, inside her residence deceased from apparent gunshot wounds. Investigators identified William Earl Toler, Jr. 48 also of Vandemere as a suspect in the death

As a local concerned community member in Pamlico County, I am deeply concerned about the ongoing efforts to undermine public education, most recently through executive actions by the Trump Administration that include eliminating the Department of Education. Halting federal support for our K-12 schools will ensure historically marginalized students do not receive equal opportunities, and will take away resources like student lunches and special education programming.

Some leaders in Washington are also pushing the proposed Educational Choice for Children Act (ECCA). If enacted nationwide, ECCA would divert billions of taxpayer dollars from our public schools to subsidize private institutions. Private schools often segregate, discriminate, and indoctrinate students. Public schools are already grappling with many budgetary and operational challenges. Voucher programs only worsen these issues, benefiting a privileged few while leaving low-income and rural students with fewer resources.

Public education is the foundation of a multiracial democracy. If we are serious about ensuring quality education for all students—not just the wealthiest—we must reject efforts to defund our public schools. I urge all of us in Pamlico County to tell our reps to oppose private school voucher initiatives and invest in strengthening our public schools.

Rochelle Meadows believes if you decide to do something, you need to give it your best.

So when the 44-year-old mother of three decided to enroll at Pamlico Community College, she went in determined to give it all she had.

"I say to always give your best," the Aurora woman said in a recent interview. "I even teach my youth group that at church."

Meadows was true to her word. She recently graduated from Pamlico with both an associate degree and diploma in the Early Childhood Education Career Track, plus four certificates.

Most impressively, she received the college's Academic Excellence Award and was named its 2025 Student of the Year. As the recipient of Pamlico's Academic Excellence Award, she became the college's 2025 honoree on the N.C. Community College System's "Great within the 58" list of high-achieving students.

"Ms. Meadows is so deserving of the Academic Excellence Award and the PCC Student of the Year Award," said Vice President of Instructional Services Neil Callahan, who was Meadows's academic advisor in the Early Childhood Education program. "She has worked very hard these past several semesters to achieve her goal, and I am so proud of her. She is proof that perseverance and hard work pay off in the end."

Vice President of Student Services Jamie D. Gibbs added, "Rochelle is a great example of how hard work and determination pay off. She is well-deserving of the awards."

Meadows's road to college began when she read an announcement about registration at PCC. She had been a member of the Aurora High Class of 1999, the last group to graduate from the former high school, but it had been a while since she was a student.

Meadows put it off, but decided on the last day of Pamlico's registration period to come to campus and give it a shot.

After enrolling for classes, Meadows stepped into a college restroom, looked in the mirror and said a prayer.

"I said, 'I'm going to give this a shot,' she recalled. "I told God, 'I'm going to show my faith, now I need you to show your power.'"

Meadows overcame her initial anxiety about classes and excelled. Determined to do her best, she often did her homework in her car or at her children's activities so she could stay on track.

And even when she encountered trouble with coursework or technology or even getting the correct textbook, Meadows said she received the support she needed from Pamlico's instructors and staffers.

Meadows recently completed the required fire safety course and is now enrolled in a CPR class. She has begun to transform her home into a center while she waits for the requisite inspections to proceed.

"I already have my house set up just like a daycare," Meadow said with a chuckle, describing the tables, high chairs, posters and other furnishings she had accumulated.

She hopes to open the center later this year.

"Without God, none of this would have been possible," Meadows said. "I thank my family, my church family, and my friends, too."

She continued, "I didn't come this far just to come this far. I'm moving forward."

New law raises Social Security income for some

Until recently, if you received a pension from a job that did not pay into Social Security and you’ve also worked in a job that did, your Social Security benefits at retirement were reduced based on your pension income.

As of Jan. 5, 2025, that’s no longer the case, thanks to the Social Security Fairness Act. Now, you’ll receive both your pension and your fully earned Social Security benefits because the Act repealed the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP).

This new law also repealed the Government Pension Offset (GPO) provision which had reduced spousal or survivor Social Security benefits for people employed in government jobs. These benefits will be increased in 2025.

There are nearly 3 million people who, depending on their situation, may see their benefits increase – from very little to \$1,000 a month or more. Those impacted fall into these professional categories: teachers, firefighters, and police officers in many states; and federal employees covered by the Civil Service Retirement System.

The Act is retroactive to January 2024, and the Social Security Administration paid an additional lump sum benefit to affected people in March 2025. Going forward, most monthly income “raises” appear on April checks (for March benefits). A few more complex cases may take a little longer.

A word of caution – beware of scammers. The Social Security Administration doesn’t tend to call, email or text; they’ll send a letter regarding changes to your retirement benefits. And they will never ask you to pay for assistance or to have your benefits started, increased, or paid retroactively. But you can call the SSA at 800-772-1213 to ask if your retirement benefits have changed.

Plan for your increased retirement income

Of course, everyone’s needs are different, so there’s no one “right” way to handle a lump sum benefit or a monthly raise in income. But here are a few suggestions:

- *Pay off some debts.* If you have credit card debt a car or student loan, you may want to pay it down, or even pay it off.
- *Invest in an individual retirement account (IRA).* If you still have “earned” income – from wages, salaries, tips, bonuses, commissions, self-employment earnings or long-term disability payments – you can contribute from these sources to an IRA. There are tax benefits and an array of investment choices, so it’s an excellent way to build resources for retirement.
- *Save for college.* If you have children, or grandchildren, who have college in their plans, you might want to put some money into a college savings vehicle, such as a 529 plan, which provides tax benefits and gives you great flexibility in distributing the money.
- *Build an emergency fund.* If you don’t already have an emergency fund with three to six months of living expenses, you can work on that. Keep the money in a liquid, low-risk account, so that it’s readily available to pay for unexpected costs. Without such a fund, you may be forced to tap into your long-term investments.

Above all, you may want to get some help. A financial professional can recommend ways of using the money to help you meet your goals. Take any recent government correspondence that shows how your retirement benefits have changed so you can build or review your retirement income strategies.

If you’re thoughtful about how you put your new income to work, you’ll be doing yourself, and your retirement, a favor.

Hornworms in Tomatoes

If the leaves of your tomato plant seem to suddenly be disappearing, take a closer look. There is a good chance there are one or more hornworms feeding on your plant. Left unchecked, hornworms can quickly devour tomato leaves and even defoliate plants. Their green color provides a perfect camouflage – as a result, hornworms, which can grow up to 3” long, often aren’t noticed until they get quite large.

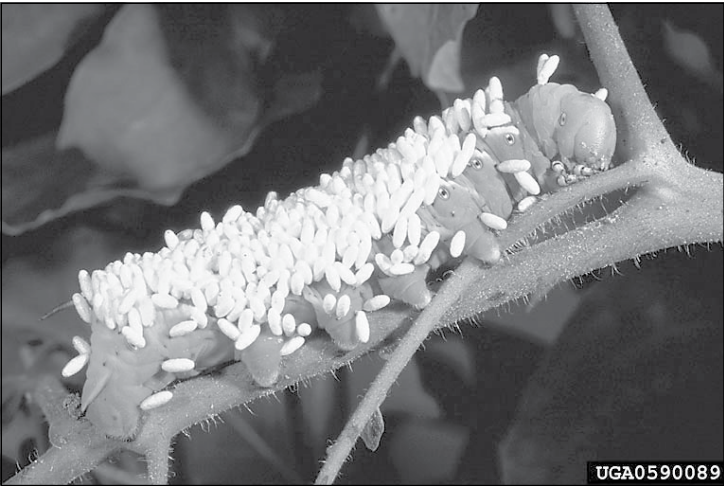
Hornworms are the caterpillar stage of sphinx moths. They get their name from the harmless spine, or horn, found on their back end. There are several different species of hornworms found in our region, two of which feed on tomato plants: the tobacco hornworm (*Manduca sexta*) and the tomato hornworm (*Manduca quinquemaculata*).

These closely related insects look very similar and both turn into medium-sized brown moths. In the caterpillar stage, the color of the horn can help you tell the difference – tobacco hornworms have red horns while the horn on a tomato hornworm is blue. Determining which type of hornworm is eating your tomato plant is not necessary to decide what you should do about them. Both hornworms are voracious feeders that should be removed from tomato plants as soon as they are found. If left to eat their fill, hornworms can kill young plants and weaken larger plants, resulting in reduced fruit production. We can have two or three generations of hornworms over the summer, so be sure to check your plants frequently for new caterpillars. If you only have a few plants, checking your plants regularly and picking the caterpillars off by hand is an effective way to control them. You can drown the caterpillars in a bucket of soapy water or feed them to the chickens. If handpicking is not feasible, there are several organic insecticides that control caterpillars, if applied when the caterpillars are small. Examples include products that contain Spinosad or B.t (*Bacillus thuringiensis*). Other common garden insecticides that contain pyrethroid class chemicals (bifenthrin, zeta cypermethrin, etc.) can also be used. When applying any pesticide, including organics, be sure to read and follow all label directions. Apply insecticides late in the evening, when bees are not active, to minimize harm to pollinators.

If you happen to find a hornworm that looks as if white cigars are growing out of its back, leave it in the garden. The “cigars” are actually the cocoons of braconid wasps. These tiny, non-stinging wasps parasitize hornworm caterpillars and help to naturally control their populations. Other beneficial insects that help control caterpillars in the garden include assassin bugs, spiders, and predatory wasps such as yellow jackets and paper wasps.

NATIONAL CPR AND AED
AWARENESS WEEK – JUNE 1-7, 2025



National CPR and AED Awareness Week runs from June 1 to 7 and aims to stress the importance of these actions to as many people as possible. Learning and mastering cardiopulmonary resuscitation (C.P.R.) techniques and automated external defibrillator (A.E.D.) use so that they can become lifelines for those who have experienced sudden medical emergencies is an honorable thing to do. The campaign also places importance on the actions of bystanders in helping deal with such emergencies, and the knowledge of these methods.

History of National CPR and AED Awareness Week

National CPR and AED Awareness Week was first initiated in 2007, following a partnership between the American Red Cross, the American Heart Association, and the National Safety Council to highlight the importance of learning C.P.R. and A.E.D. techniques to save lives.

Knowing C.P.R. techniques or how to properly use A.E.D.s can be the difference between life and death for those who have experienced sudden medical emergencies. It only takes up to four to six minutes without oxygen for the brain to experience damage, therefore the time of response, and proper execution of these measures, are crucial in potentially saving many lives around the world. Both actions should be performed only if a patient is proven to be non-responsive and stopped breathing.

C.P.R. and A.E.D.s are useful in helping people who have suffered ailments such as cardiac arrests, asthma attacks, diabetes, strokes, and allergic reactions. The Sudden Cardiac Arrest Foundation notes that up to 356,000 cardiac arrests happen in the U.S. annually, with 90% of them fatal, and can take place anywhere, meaning that the more people who know C.P.R. are around, the better. Several states have also made it mandatory for workplaces to have A.E.D.s around for possible emergencies.

Waiting for emergency medical service workers (E.M.S.) to arrive at the scene and deal with the matter will take time. If you or someone around you knows C.P.R. or how to operate a defibrillator, it can make an important difference for the patient. You would be surprised at the willingness of strangers to come help when someone is experiencing a medical emergency, and you can be one of them. It's never pleasant seeing someone at the cusp of death, and so, the actions of C.P.R.-trained individuals can help prevent emergencies from getting worse. All it takes is a willingness to learn how.

5 Important Facts About Cardiac Arrest

1. Time is of the essence

A.E.D. usage within the first three minutes of sudden cardiac arrest increases the survival rate by over 80%.

2. The abnormal heart rhythm

Ventricular fibrillation (V.F.) is the name of the abnormal heart rhythm that usually triggers cardiac arrest.

3. It is a serious killer

Cardiac arrest globally claims more lives than colorectal cancer, breast cancer, influenza, pneumonia, and influenza combined.

4. The main differences

The difference between a heart attack and cardiac arrest is that a heart attack happens when the blood flow to the heart is blocked, while cardiac arrest is when the heart stops beating.

5. It can happen to anyone

Anyone of any age can experience sudden cardiac arrest, with up to 2,000 people under the age of 25 dying each year in the United States because of it.

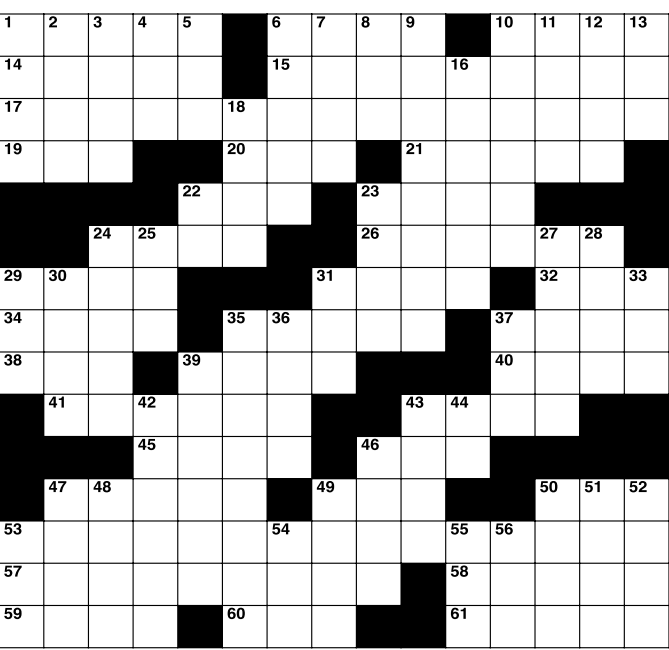

- Make sure all plugs are inserted completely into their wall sockets.
- If your pet seems interested in electrical cords, check the cords frequently for signs of fraying and replace any damaged cords immediately.
- Appliances near sinks and bathtubs should only be plugged into outlets equipped with ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection in case an electrical appliance is knocked into the water.

District Attorney Scott Thomas Announces Retirement

District Attorney Scott Thomas announced today that he will retire as District Attorney effective August 1, 2025. Thomas, 58 years old, has served as District Attorney of Prosecutorial District Four (Carteret, Craven, and Pamlico Counties) since January 2006. He was initially appointed to replace retiring District Attorney David McFadyen and has since been elected five times. Prior to becoming District Attorney, he was an attorney in private practice and served the State of North Carolina as a Supreme Court Law Clerk, Assistant District Attorney, State Representative, and State Senator. He has earned full retirement eligibility with a combined total of over 28 years of service to the State of North Carolina. Over 26 of those years as an elected official, and over 20 years in the District Attorney's Office as District Attorney and as an Assistant District Attorney.



District Attorney Thomas said, "it has been an honor to serve the people of our District and State for over 28 years. I thank the citizens for first electing me as their State Representative in 1998 at the age of 32, and then electing me eight more times as a State Senator and District Attorney. As District Attorney, I've worked alongside our staff of 14 assistant district attorneys, 14 legal assistants, and an investigator to prosecute criminals, protect victims, and promote public safety. I have been blessed to work with an outstanding staff of dedicated professionals throughout my time as DA. Many of our ADAs are career prosecutors who train other prosecutors and law enforcement officers statewide. Some of my former ADAs are now Judges in our District. We have enjoyed good working relationships with others in the criminal justice system including past and present law enforcement, probation officers, Judges, Clerks of Court, NC Conference of District Attorneys, and all those who work in our courts. I'm especially grateful for my close working relationships with Sheriffs Asa Buck, Chris Davis, and Chip Hughes. We've spent a lot of time together over the years serving the people of our prosecutorial district. We've maintained a comprehensive approach to crime and public safety to include education, prevention, treatment, and tough enforcement. The citizens of our District have been very supportive of our law enforcement and prosecutorial efforts. I'm also thankful for the advice and counsel of former District Attorney David McFadyen. Finally, my family and friends have been with me throughout my time in public service and they have been very supportive during my many years as an elected official."

District Attorney Thomas believes in a firm and fair approach to prosecution. He sought prison sentences for violent offenders, repeat offenders, and drug traffickers. He also helped lead efforts in the district to address the opioid crisis, provide substance use disorder treatment alternatives to incarceration, create Child Advocacy Centers, and initiatives in crime reduction and re-entry. Thomas said, "two of the most rewarding aspects of this job have been advocating in court on behalf of crime victims and their surviving family members in pursuit of justice and helping non-violent first-time offenders who made a mistake but have shown they deserve a second chance."

Thomas went on to say, "I reached a longevity step and could have retired in January 2025, but I decided to stay for several additional months to better prepare our office for the transition moving forward. During that time, I've led our office through the implementation of the new eCourts online filing and case management system, completed some pending investigations and cases, and hired three new ADAs and two new legal assistants. Our office is now well positioned for the transition and the future. I will work with the Governor on having my replacement appointed and will work with whoever is selected during the transition to assure the continued effective operation of our office."

District Attorney Thomas has been a licensed attorney for 33 years and is a graduate of West Craven High School, East Carolina University, and North Carolina Central University School of Law. Prior to becoming District Attorney, he was a Banker, Law Clerk to a NC Supreme Court Justice, Assistant District Attorney, Attorney in private practice, State Representative, and State Senator. While District Attorney, he was also Chairman of the NC Governor's Crime Commission, and President of the NC Conference of District Attorneys. He has received numerous awards and recognitions over the years for his contributions as an elected official. In December 2024, he received the NC Attorney General's Dogwood Award for public service. In April 2025, he received the Save Lives Together Award from the Fentanyl Victims Network of North Carolina. Upon retirement as District Attorney, Thomas will continue his professional legal career by returning to the private practice of law. An announcement on those plans will be made later.
